*Dear Esteemed Members,*

## ప్రధాన కార్యదర్శి గారి డెస్క్ నుండి

ఆదరణీయ సభ్యులారా,

**25.06.2026 న హైదరాబాద్ లో జరగనున్న భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల సంఘం హైదరాబాద్ సర్కిల్ వార్షిక సర్వ సభ్య సమావేశానికి ఆదరణీయ సభ్యులకు ఆహ్వానం.**

మన సంఘ నియమావళి ప్రకారం 25 జూన్ 2026 న నిర్వహించబడనున్న భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల సంఘం హైదరాబాద్ సర్కిల్ వార్షిక సర్వ సభ్య సమావేశానికి మీ ప్రతి ఒక్కరికీ హృదయపూర్వక ఆహ్వానం అందించడం నాకు గౌరవంగా మరియు ఆనందంగా భావిస్తున్నాను.

2. ఈ సంఘాన్ని ఇటుక ఇటుకగా నిర్మించిన మీ అందరినీ - మీ నిబద్ధతతో, త్యాగంతో, ఆప్యాయతతో, విశ్వాసంతో ఈ సంస్థను నిలబెట్టిన సభ్యులందరినీ - వ్యక్తిగతంగా చేరుకోవాలని నా హృదయపూర్వక కోరిక. అయితే ఆచరణాత్మక పరిమితుల వల్ల ప్రతి ఒక్కరిని వ్యక్తిగతంగా కలవడం సాధ్యంకాకపోవచ్చు. అయినప్పటికీ, ఈ సందేశాన్ని మీరు చదివేటప్పుడు ప్రతి పంక్తిలోనూ నా ఆత్మీయతను, మన భవిష్యత్తుపై నా చింతనను మీరు అనుభూతి చెందుతారని నమ్ముతున్నాను.

3. ఆదరణీయ సభ్యులారా, ఈ సర్వ సభ్య సమావేశం కేవలం ఒక ఆచార కార్యక్రమం కాదు. అజెండా అంశాలను చదివి యాంత్రికంగా సమావేశాన్ని ముగించే కార్యక్రమం కాదు. ప్రతి అంశాన్ని గంభీరంగా చర్చించి, అర్థవంతంగా నిర్ణయాలు తీసుకోవాలనే సంకల్పంతో ఈ సమావేశాన్ని నిర్వహిస్తున్నాము. మీ నిర్మాణాత్మక విమర్శలు, విలువైన సూచనలు, అనుభవపూర్వక మార్గదర్శకత్వం మన సంఘానికి గొప్ప బలం.

4. ఈ సంఘం దశాబ్దాలుగా పెన్షనర్ల నిబద్ధత, ఆప్యాయత, త్యాగం, విశ్వాసంతో నిర్మించబడింది, బలోపేతం చేయబడింది, కాపాడబడింది మరియు ముందుకు నడిపించబడింది. అందువల్ల ఈ సర్వ సభ్య సమావేశం కేవలం హాజరుతో పరిమితం కాకుండా, భావోద్వేగ అనుబంధంతో కూడిన భాగస్వామ్యాన్ని ప్రతిబింబించాలి.

5. ఈ సమావేశాన్ని భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల సంక్షేమం, గౌరవం, భద్రత మరియు శ్రేయస్సుకు అంకితమైన ఒక స్మరణీయమైన కార్యక్రమంగా మలచాలని మన సంకల్పం.

6. అదే సమయంలో ఒక వాస్తవాన్ని మనం అంగీకరించాలి. చురుకుగా, ప్రభావవంతంగా కొనసాగాలంటే ఏ సంస్థకైనా ఆర్థిక బలం అవసరం. భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల సంఘం హైదరాబాద్ సర్కిల్ కూడా దీనికి మినహాయింపు కాదు. ప్రస్తుతం మన సంఘం ఆర్థిక పరిస్థితి బలహీనంగా ఉంది. అందువల్ల ప్రతి సభ్యుని నుండి సామూహిక సహకారం అవసరం.

**7. అందువల్ల ప్రతి సభ్యునికి నా హృదయపూర్వక విజ్ఞప్తి:**

- సర్వ సభ్య సమావేశానికి అధిక సంఖ్యలో హాజరుకావాలి;
- పూర్తి మనసుతో నిర్మాణాత్మకంగా పాల్గొనాలి; మరియు
- సంఘ బలోపేతానికి ఆర్థిక సహాయం అందించాలి.

8. ప్రతి సభ్యుడు కనీసం ₹300 విరాళం అందించాలని మనవి. అయితే గరిష్ఠ పరిమితి మీ ఔదార్యం, మీ సామర్థ్యం, ముఖ్యంగా పెన్షనర్ల సంక్షేమంపై మీ విశ్వాసంపై ఆధారపడి ఉంటుంది.

9. ప్రతి విరాళం - చిన్నదైనా, పెద్దదైనా - కేవలం ఆర్థిక సహాయం మాత్రమే కాదు. అది సంఘంపై మరియు పెన్షనర్ల సామూహిక బలంపై మీ విశ్వాసానికి ప్రతీక.

10. మన సంఖ్యలు ముఖ్యమైనవి. మన ఐక్యత ఇంకా ముఖ్యమైనది. పెద్ద సంఖ్యలో సభ్యుల పాల్గొనడం ద్వారా పెన్షనర్లు ఐక్యంగా, చైతన్యంతో, సంఘటితంగా ఉన్నారనే బలమైన సందేశం భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకుకు వెళ్తుంది.

11. అలాగే దేశవ్యాప్తంగా భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల హక్కుల కోసం నిరంతరం కృషి చేస్తున్న అఖిల భారత భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల సంఘముల సమాఖ్య ప్రధాన కార్యదర్శి శ్రీ జి.డి. నదాఫ్ గారికి కూడా ఈ సమావేశం బలాన్నిస్తుంది. ఆయన ఆ రోజు సమావేశానికి స్టార్ అతిథిగా విచ్చేయడం మనందరికీ గౌరవకారణం.

12. అలాగే శ్రీ ఎన్. రాధాకృష్ణన్ మన సర్కిల్ అధ్యక్షులు, అఖిల భారత భారతీయ స్టేట్ బ్యాంకు పెన్షనర్ల సంఘముల సమాఖ్య అధ్యక్షులుగా కూడా సేవలందిస్తున్నవారు, పెన్షనర్ల సంఘానికి తమ మార్గదర్శకత్వం, ప్రోత్సాహం, నాయకత్వాన్ని నిబద్ధతతో అందిస్తున్నారు. వారి సాన్నిధ్యం, సహకారం మన సంఘానికి బలం, విశ్వాసం, స్ఫూర్తిగా నిలుస్తున్నాయి.

13. చరిత్ర చెబుతోంది -సంస్థలు కేవలం తీర్మానాలతో ఎదగవు; కష్టకాలంలో ధైర్యంతో, నిబద్ధతతో ఐక్యంగా నిలబడే సభ్యులతోనే ఎదుగుతాయి. అలాంటి సమయం ఇప్పుడు మన ముందుంది.

14. కాబట్టి 25 జూన్ 2026 న మనమందరం కొత్త ఉత్సాహంతో, పరస్పర ఆప్యాయతతో, సామూహిక బాధ్యతాభావంతో, సంఘ బలోపేత సంకల్పంతో కలుసుకుందాం.

## **REQUEST FOR FRATERNAL SUPPORT FOR STRIKE AND AGITATIONAL PROGRAMMES**

We convey our warm fraternal greetings to you and all members.

The All India State Bank of India Staff Federation has decided to observe a countrywide strike on 25th and 26th May 2026,after sustained efforts to resolve several important issues through the established bilateral mechanism have not yielded the desired results.

The prolonged delay in the recruitment of Messengers has resulted in a significant reduction in subordinate staff strength, while also denying employment opportunities to economically weaker sections. At the same time, outsourcing is increasingly being resorted to for duties of a permanent and perennial nature.

The last recruitment of Armed Guards was undertaken in 2022. Since then, security-related incidents have increased, while the strength of guards has declined due to retirements and promotions without fresh recruitment. In place of regular appointments, outsourced guards are being engaged despite the availability of provisions for direct recruitment. This raises serious concerns regarding the safety of employees, customers, and bank assets, as well as potential operational and reputational risks.

Inter-circle transfers, as agreed under the Memorandum of Settlement dated 27.07.2017 between State Bank of India and the Federation, have been discontinued for employees recruited from 2019 onwards, causing significant hardship and amounting to a unilateral deviation from the agreed terms.

The growing outsourcing of permanent and regular jobs, beyond agreed norms, is adversely affecting job security and service conditions. It is also observed that outsourced workers are often not paid wages commensurate with their work, which is against the principle of fair wages and the spirit of the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act.

Further, the review of the Career Progression Scheme is due and essential to ensure fair career growth and employee motivation. Issues relating to parity in wage outcomes, extension of stagnation benefits to eligible 10th Bipartite retirees, implementation of agreed physician consultation charges, and improvement in the Medical Reimbursement Scheme remain unresolved. Concerns also persist regarding inclusion of all pay components for pension of 7th BPS retirees and providing flexibility to NPS employees in choosing Pension Fund Managers.

In addition, the delay in nomination of the Workmen Director, non-appointment of PF Trustees, and increasing pressure of mis-selling in the name of cross-selling are causing concern among employees and adversely affecting morale and customer service.

Despite sustained efforts over the past two years, these issues remain unresolved; accordingly, the Federation has **decided to undertake** a series of agitational programmes, culminating in the strike action, to secure resolution of these genuine concerns.

In this context, we have taken up the issues relating to pay components for pension of 7th BPS retirees and the extension of stagnation benefits to eligible 10th Bipartite retirees. We earnestly seek your full fraternal support and solidarity.

## **RETIRED EMPLOYEES MEDICAL BENEFIT SCHEME – ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERSHIP TO NPS OPTees ON THEIR RETIREMENT**

It is known that the SBI Retired Employees Medical Benefit Scheme has been introduced in the Bank with a view to provide financial assistance for meeting, partly or fully, within specific monetary limits for hospitalization / post- hospitalisation expenses for treatment of specified diseases/ailments and domiciliary expenses for any disease to all retired employees and their spouses and their dependent family members.

2. In this connection, we bring to your kind information that even though the eligibility for membership, as approved by the SBI REMBS Trustees, specifies that the employees, who will retire from the Bank's service in normal course on attaining the age of retirement, which at present is 60 years, we are informed that the retired NPS Optees are not being permitted to become beneficiary of SBI REMBS. We also understand

that membership is being denied in these cases, quoting mandatory requirement of 30 years of pensionable service with 58 years of age, which applies to those employees who have left the Bank's service on Voluntary Retirement.

4. We are at a loss to understand the reason behind denial of membership of REMBS to retiree NPS Optees, particularly, when the status of member of NPS is taken into account for Payment of Gratuity as per Act, instead of service gratuity. Further, all employees, who are recruited on or after 01.08.2010 and who are covered under New Pension Scheme are also putting their good efforts in the growth and prosperity of the Bank and we are of the humble view that these NPS Optees after their retirement should also be provided with all the facilities at par with the retired employees of bank who were/are covered the SBI Employees Pension Fund Rules/Regulations. Hence, we request your goodself to initiate necessary steps to amend the SBI REMBS appropriately so as to provide membership to those retired/retiring NPS Optees on similar terms and conditions as applicable to employees, who retired/retires and covered under SBI Employees' Pension Fund Rules/Regulations.

5. Please acknowledge receipt of this communication and advise us the developments in this regard..

**ENSUING WAGE REVISION NEGOTIATIONS FOR THE PERIOD  
FROM NOVEMBER 2027 TO OCTOBER 2032  
BETWEEN INDIAN BANKS' ASSOCIATION (IBA) AND  
WORKMEN UNIONS & OFFICERS' ASSOCIATIONS  
SUBMISSION OF COMMON CHARTER OF DEMANDS  
ON BEHALF OF BANK PENSIONERS AND RETIREES**

On the suggestion of Federation of SBI Pensioners' Associations (FSBIPA), it has been decided by CBPRO (Coordination of Bank Pensioners and Retirees Organisations) to prepare a comprehensive Charter of Demands on behalf of all Bank Pensioners and Retirees as early as possible and submit the same to IBA. It has also been decided by CBPRO to pursue the residual issues concerning the Bank Pensioners and Retirees, which are yet to be resolved.

2. We also draw your attention to the communique sent by Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance, Government of India vide their letter dated 20th April, 2026 to the Indian Banks' Association to conclude the Wage Negotiation for the ensuing 13th Bipartite Settlement / 10th Joint Note for the period starting from 1st November 2027 to 31st October 2032 and also relative amendments to the Regulations, where necessary, well before the conclusion of the present Wage Settlement period i.e. before 31st October 2027.

3. In view of this important development, it is imperative that the Common Charter of demands of Bank Pensioners and Retirees need to be submitted to IBA at the earliest.
4. We may have to submit charter of demands to our Chairman also, as some of the issues concerning the pensioners and retirees are applicable to SBI only.
5. Hence, we request all the Circle Affiliates of FSBIPA to give their valuable inputs to us at the earliest, preferably within 15 days so that we can compile and prepare a comprehensive Charter of Demands. Our proposal along with the proposals of other Banks Pensioners & Retirees Organisations would be finalised, during June / July 2026, in the meeting of the Leaders of the Constituent Units of CBPRO, to which the undersigned is the Joint Convenor.
6. The finalised Common Charter of Demands would then be submitted to IBA. It is also decided to vigorously pursue the negotiating status to Bank Pensioners and Retirees Organisations, inasmuch as the important issues of Pensioners and Retirees can only be effectively presented discussed I negotiated with the IBA by the Pensioners and Retirees Organisation.
7. In view of the above, we once again request you to forward your valuable inputs, at the same time, reasonable suggestions for preparing the Common Charter of Demands of Bank Pensioners and Retirees before 31-05-2026.

## REJECTION REVIEW MEETING ON POLICY A & B MEDICAL CLAIMS FOR THE PERIOD 16.01.2026 TO 30.04.2026

The Rejection Review Committee Meeting was held on 15th May 2026 at State Bank of India, Hyderabad LHO under the guidance of DGM & CDO.

The meeting was attended by AGM (HR), CM (IR), CM HRs of AOs, Bank Medical Officers, Family Health Plan Insurance TPA Limited Team, Anand Rathi Insurance Brokers Limited Team, and officials of HR & PPG Departments.

The President, General Secretary and Deputy General Secretaries of Hyderabad AO, Secunderabad AO and Cyberabad AO of SBI Pensioners Association attended the meeting.

52 claims proposed for rejection by Family Health Plan Insurance TPA Limited were subjected to detailed scrutiny by the Committee.

Out of the 52 cases reviewed, it was observed that 36 claims were found not admissible under the policy guidelines mainly on account of:

- No hospitalisation / only diagnostic tests
- Ailments like gastritis, spondylitis, ophthalmic cases other than glaucoma, etc.
- Dental treatment other than Root Canal Treatment (RCT)
- Hospitalisation below 24 hours under Policy B
- OPD cases claimed under Policy B
- Claims exceeding prescribed caps / sub-limits
- Diseases / ailments not covered under the 67 specified diseases under Policy A (OPD/IPD)

During the detailed review, the Association representatives, with utmost concern for genuine claimants, referred each case on merits and the Bank Medical Officers highlighted that certain cases deserve reconsideration based on medical reports and surrounding clinical conditions, despite technical grounds for rejection.

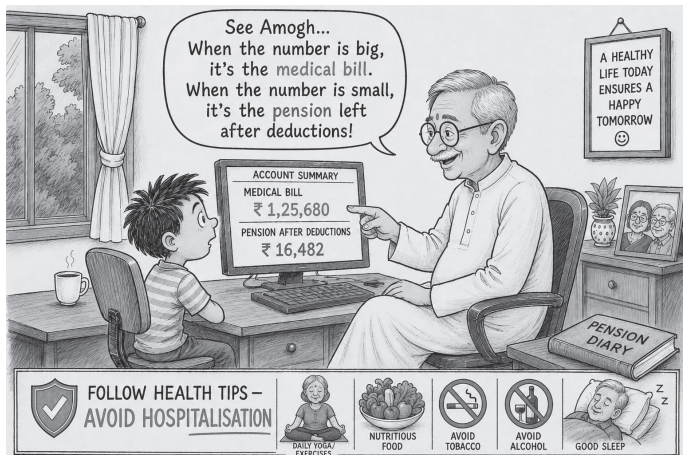
The Association also suggested that cases under Policy B, which were rejected, may be considered under Policy A wherever eligible/ applicable.

Further, Family Health Plan Insurance TPA Limited agreed to place the Committee's views on all 16 rejected cases for reconsideration by the competent authorities and SBI General Insurance Company Limited.

We sincerely thank DGM & CDO for his keen intervention and guidance in ensuring proper review of genuine cases.

We also sincerely request our members to familiarise themselves with the guidelines contained in the brochure circulated by Anand Rathi Insurance Brokers Limited and prefer claims strictly in accordance with the policy provisions to avoid disappointment at a later stage.
